## Session B2: Building an Indigenous Resilience-Focused Lens Pt. 2

**Workshop Description:** Protective factors can greatly decrease the potential harmful impacts of risk factors for AI/AN youth. This session will provide an understanding of protective factors and promote best practices among participants who will construct programming that can reduce the impact of risk factors. The focus on protective factors will build resilience through cultural connection and tribal identity to promote and support the safety of AI/AN youth, families, and communities and encourage AI/AN youth to live productive lives that contribute to their community's well-being.

- Victimization and Juvenile Offending
  - This fact sheet discusses the correlation between victimization and juvenile offending. It offers information about the effects of victimization on development, the relationship between victimization and juvenile offending, why the two are related, and the cycle of victimization and subsequent offending.
- Trauma Among Girls in the Juvenile Justice System
   This fact sheet gives details about the growing number of girls in the juvenile justice. It outlines the prevalence of trauma exposure among justice-involved girls, the prevalence of PTSD among justice-involved girls, potential consequences of trauma for girls, the impact of juvenile justice system on traumatized girls, and gender responsive programming.
- Trauma-Focused Interventions for Youth in the Juvenile Justice System
   This fact sheet describes evidence-informed interventions for youth involved in the
   juvenile justice system. It covers interventions that address posttraumatic emotional
   and behavioral problems, setting the stage before providing or referring for a
   therapeutic intervention, intervention for traumatized adolescents, interventions for
   traumatized youth involved in the juvenile justice system, and additional clinical
   considerations when working with youth involved in the juvenile justice system.
- Assessing Exposure to Psychological Trauma and Post-Traumatic Stress in the Juvenile Justice Population
  - This fact sheet explores the importance, clinical considerations, and approaches to assessing for psychological trauma and posttraumatic stress with youth in the juvenile justice population. It addresses challenges that are unique to assessment within the juvenile justice environment.
- Trauma-Informed Juvenile Justice Roundtable: Current Issues and New Directions in Creating Trauma-Informed Juvenile Justice Systems
  - This collection of briefs written by experts invited to the NCTSN Trauma-Informed Juvenile Justice Roundtable address topics essential to creating trauma-informed juvenile justice systems. There is an introduction to the NCTSN Trauma-Informed Juvenile Justice Roundtable, description of the current issues and essential elements of a trauma-informed juvenile justice system, and an outline of possible new directions for the future.
